1. Soccer

House league wants to make soccer enjoyable for all ages. A suggestion from Gord McDonald was that we could extend the micro group for 6 yr olds. There is an issue with 6yr olds playing with 4 yr olds; however, at the 6 and 7 yr olds there is usually one that sticks out in the crowd as a good player and the others seem to stay grouped up. General consensus is that 6yr olds and 4 yr olds shouldn't be playing together, primarily because of ability. Debbie will take this discussion back to the soccer association. In general, it is up to the discretion of the coordinator if someone would like to stay down at the micro level.

Advertising micro soccer should be more visible to help boost the numbers this year.

2. Soccer letter

People are concerned about soccer fees. How much of our grant goes to soccer and how much will go to maintenance? The money we get is the same as the membership fee. \$50 goes to the club; \$35 is for soccer in Dunrobin. Of the \$35, \$10 would go back to the Community Association. Other communities take the full \$35 and charge a user fee. Should we be charging a membership fee (per family, per year). This has never been done in Dunrobin. How much money is used for soccer (DOUG?) All soccer money goes to grass cutting and lining. Part of the \$50 includes a fee for the tournament. DCA, balls, nets, grass cutting, lining, jerseys for goalies. The soccer jerseys that are sold allow the house league to break even. Other Associations are considering charging a user fee (ie, \$15 on top of regular fee). Who issues the tax receipt (DCA or Soccer)? This is now an accounting issue. (DOUG)
This issue needs to be discussed between Darryl/Doug and John/Treasurer, as well as with the other Assoc. presidents.

3. Hockey

Outdoor hockey registration is Dec 1 and 5; there will be an older group (13 and 15). Other community centres are stating 8 week tender period for ice. Outdoor hockey will start after school starts in January, and end near the end of Feb.

4. Maintenance Update

Paul has been working in the shed, providing shelves, stairs, etc. Shed has been repainted, and the City has replaced the lights. Phone doesn't work (still). This has been reported twice now (about 8 weeks out). Talon's are supposed to be out of the shed. Kim will check with Janice regarding use.

5. Canada Day
